Installation Guide: Villeroy & Boch Farmhouse 595 Ceramic Sink

What You'll Need:

- Villeroy & Boch Farmhouse 595 ceramic sink
- Solid countertop (stone, quartz, solid wood, compact laminate not regular chipboard laminate)
- High-quality silicone sealant (neutral-cure, sanitary grade)
- Support frame or mounting brackets (depending on your setup)
- Drill, screwdriver
- Clamps or adjustable supports
- Spirit level
- Measuring tape
- A helper the sink is heavy (approx. 25+ kg)

Sink Overview:

- External size: 595 x 500 mm

- Sink depth: ~180-200 mm

- Min. base cabinet: 600 mm

- Weight: ~25.7 kg

- Overflow: Yes

- Rear: Unglazed back - must be placed flush against a wall or panel

Installation Instructions:

- 1. Prepare the Cutout
- Measure and mark the sink cutout from a physical template (preferably using the actual sink).
- Cutout should be slightly smaller than the outer dimensions of the sink to allow it to mount below the countertop.

- Do not use factory measurements only - ceramic sinks may have dimensional variation (±1%).

2. Build a Support Frame

- Since the sink is heavy, it must be supported from below (do not rely on silicone alone).
- Use a wooden frame or mounting cleats/shelves fitted inside the cabinet walls to carry the sink's weight.
- Leave enough clearance for the sink bowl and plumbing below.

3. Dry Fit the Sink

- Place the sink on the support frame and check that it is centered and level.
- Use a spirit level to ensure correct alignment.

4. Apply Silicone

- Remove the sink temporarily.
- Apply a continuous bead of sanitary silicone around the top rim of the sink this creates a waterproof seal.

5. Mount the Sink

- Carefully lower the sink back into the support frame.
- Press it gently against the underside of the countertop silicone should make full contact.
- Use clamps (if possible) to keep pressure on the sink as the silicone cures.
- Let the silicone cure for at least 24 hours.

6. Connect Plumbing

- Fit the waste outlet and overflow.
- Ensure all plumbing connections are tight and leak-free.

7. Seal and Clean

- After the silicone has cured, inspect the perimeter.
- Apply additional silicone if needed and clean any excess.

Quick Summary Table:

- 1. Cut the countertop using the sink as a guide.
- 2. Build a sturdy support frame inside the cabinet.
- 3. Dry-fit and level the sink.
- 4. Apply sanitary silicone to the rim.
- 5. Mount the sink and clamp in place.
- 6. Connect plumbing and test for leaks.
- 7. Seal interior edges and clean up.

Tips:

- Always install the sink before securing the countertop in place.
- This model is modular it doesn't come with mounting hardware, so framing is essential.
- Use neutral-cure silicone to prevent damage to ceramic or stone.
- For stone countertops, consider using a professional fabricator.
